## Governors Prepare Anti-Riot Program

NEW YORK (AP) — Eight Republican governors say prompt, firm law enforcement is needed in preventing riots and they outlined a 10-point program for dealing with social justice and lawlessness.

In presenting their "action program" to deal with "the tragic epidemic of riots," the governors charged yesterday the federal government had failed to provide adequate solutions for the nation's urban racial problems.

**ROCKEFELLER SUMMONS**  
The governors were summoned by Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller as chairman of the policy committee of the Republican Governor's Association to discuss means of easing racial tensions in American cities.

Their report, issued after a day-long closed session, said the action program was designed to inaugurate a new era of creative state leadership to meet a national crisis of social justice and lawlessness.

Michigan Gov. George Romney said he felt the most important recommendation was that dealing with urban disorders is the responsibility of the states as well as its responsibility in national defense.

## Finch Says Tiff With Reagan Is Ironed Out

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — Lt. Gov. Robert H. Finch said yesterday that his differences with Gov. Ronald Reagan over a job corps program have been "ironed out."

Finch called the squabble "a misunderstanding."

"The trouble developed for reasons only its staff knows," the Republican lieutenant governor told a news conference. "We found out where the trouble was. It's all now ironed out."

Reagan and some of his aides criticized Finch on grounds his action implied the governor's endorsement of private industry to help meet unemployment needs was unsuccessful.

The lieutenant governor also said he is still supporting Reagan as a favorite son candidate.

**Abortions Up**  
VIENNA — The number of abortions was higher than the number of live births during the first six months of this year in Czechoslovakia, figures showed today.

Statistics showed a population increase of 25,000 between January and June 30 of this year, pushing the total population to 13,800,000. Some 29,000 abortions were performed during the same period.

**Cool Blow**

## King Blames Call For More Negroes In Guard

### Timid Whites Brings Mixed Official Reactions For Violence

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — Dr. Martin Luther King said yesterday that the number of Negroes in the American Guard is being caused by "timid white people who refuse to recognize their own responsibility."

King, speaking to the National Association of Real Estate Brokers, a largely Negro group, said the "time has come to speak the truth about riots in this country."

**HOPE LOST**  
King said that he considered "socially destructive and defeating," but he has to get to remember that our people are rising because they have lost hope in the solution of certain intolerable conditions.

"My motto is not burn, baby, burn," but rather "build, baby, build, organize, baby, organize," King said. "But we must not perpetuate injustice by only condemning riots and not the conditions that are a part of them."

He blamed middle class Caucasians, the Johnson administration, Congress, state legislatures, labor unions and clergymen for "ignoring fundamental injustices."

"Riots are caused by a national administration more concerned about winning the war in Vietnam than improving conditions here at home."

**CONGRESS HIT**  
"Riots are caused by a Congress which is hypocritical and insensible to conditions in America—a Congress which is more anti-Negro than anti-race."

"Riots are caused by state legislatures, California certainly not withstanding that refuse to pass fair housing bills."

King said he always is "a little disturbed when I hear myself described as a 'responsible Negro leader' because all too often that means a blackman who will tell the white power structure just what they want to hear, instead of the truth. I say the time has come to the truth."

**Ghetto Life**  
He said ghetto life is a "long and desolate corridor with no exit sign where people must live not with wall-to-wall carpets, but wall-to-wall roaches and filth."

He said the ultimate test of a great nation is whether it is a compassionate nation and ultimately, a great individual is a compassionate individual."

## Call For More Negroes In Guard

### Brings Mixed Official Reactions

WASHINGTON (AP) — A presidential panel's bid to boost the number of Negro National Guardsmen is drawing mixed reaction on Capitol Hill while generating doubts at the Pentagon and among Guard officials.

Sen. Fred R. Harris, a member of the President's Advisory Commission on Civil Disorders, which recommended yesterday getting more Negroes into the Guard, said that would make the Guard more effective in dealing with ghetto riots.

President Johnson told Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara to give the commission's recommendations immediate attention. The Pentagon reported later that McNamara had the panel's report and was studying it.

But an officer observed, "The secretary of defense doesn't have powers of conscription to make Negroes join the Guard."

He said the National Guard has had an active campaign the last three years to recruit Negroes and "they just don't want to be they." Guard representatives have gone before Negro groups, civic organizations and colleges soliciting Negro enlistments without success, a spokesman said.

Members of the advisory panel said they studied statistics showing Negro Guard membership slumped from zero in North Dakota and New Hampshire to a high of 2807 in the District of Columbia—while alone had a Negro Guard membership percentage in double figures, but also has a 65 per cent Negro population.
